CTS Licence Truck Tag Management Policy

Additional Truck Tags Redistributed

On November 15, 2023, the Office of the BC Container Trucking Commissioner (“OBCCTC”) issued an Industry Advisory regarding revocation of underutilized truck tags. On November 17, 2022 the OBCCTC issued a Bulletin inviting applications for a limited number of truck tags available for redistribution after being returned to the OBCCTC.

The OBCCTC had approximately 30 tags available for redistribution and received applications from 32 companies requesting a total of 185 tags.

The final number of tags assigned to each applicant was based on an assessment of the licensee’s existing truck tag utilization as well as its business case, business plan and compliance history in accordance with the OBCCTC CTS Licence Truck Tag Management Policy (June 2020). The onus was on applicants to submit complete, fully articulated, and supported applications to demonstrate a need for additional truck tags. Each applicant received detailed reasons for the decision concerning their application.

Based on the above, the OBCCTC has now redistributed five I/O tags and five company truck tags to those licensees who successfully demonstrated the need for additional truck tags.

If any licensee has additional short-term work available, they are encouraged to contact the OBCCTC.
