Regulated fuel surcharge protects truckers from rising fuel costs

The Office of the British Columbia Container Trucking Commissioner (“OBCCTC”) has published the April’s fuel surcharge for independent operators at 50% based on the increase in cost of diesel to an approximate average of \$2.30 per liter in March 2026.

The regulated fuel surcharge is a responsive tool that ensures that the rising diesel prices do not erode the earnings of independent operators who perform regulated container trucking services. In addition, the minimum regulated hourly and trip rates paid to independent operators and company drivers ensure truckers are fairly compensated for the work they perform.

The OBCCTC will continue to monitor pay records to ensure the applicable fuel surcharge is being applied accurately and promptly paid to truckers each month.
